Family Liturgy

Forty Years in the Desert/Desserts

I was ordained a priest by Patrick Cardinal O'Boyle at the Cathedral of St. Matthew on Saturday 13 May 1972.

I served four years as an assistant pastor at St. Bartholomew Parish in Bethesda (1972-1976). I taught religion once a week at the parish school for the third, fourth, fifth and sixth grades, and in the CCD program for high school. One of the students I taught in the school was future OLVP parishioner Janet Korol. Encouraged by William Cardinal Baum, I began my doctoral studies at the Catholic University of America as a part-time student.

My second assignment was at Christ the King Parish in Silver Spring (1976-1980). I served as the Director of Religious Education, and as a chaplain at two nursing homes located in the parish. Cardinal Baum appointed me to serve on his doctrinal commission. Future OLVP parishioner Ed Gonzalez helped me with annual Boy Scout retreats for the Archdiocese of Washington.

I served at St. Rose of Lima Parish in Gaithersburg as an associate pastor (1980-1983) and as parochial administrator (1983-1984). I completed my Doctorate in Ministry, was appointed Archdiocesan Chaplain for the Boy Scouts, and began teaching in the Philosophy Department at Montgomery College where I earned the rank of Adjunct Professor. I presided at the wedding of future OLVP parishioners Thomas and Barbara Moschella.

As associate pastor at St. Jane de Chantal Parish (1984-1988), I taught religion weekly in the parish school's seventh and eighth grades and high school in the CCD program. I was one of several chaplains at three nursing homes in the parish and at Suburban Hospital. James Cardinal Hickey appointed me as chaplain to the police officers of Montgomery County.

While an assistant pastor at Mother Seton Parish (1988-1990), I was asked by James Cardinal Hickey to explore the possibility of establishing a parish in the Darnestown area

I moved to a house in Darnestown in December of 1990. Many of the founding families of OLVP are former parishioners at Mother Seton Parish.

The Parish of Our Lady of the Visitation was canonically established by James Cardinal Hickey on 31 May 1991. I was installed as the first pastor of OLVP by Bishop Alvaro Corrada del Rio, S.J., on 29 June 1991.

It is a privilege to have helped in the establishment of Mary of Nazareth School (1994). As pastor, it was a joy to oversee the building of our Church and to be present at its Solemn Dedication by Theodore Cardinal McCarrick (31 May 2001). In 2004 Cardinal McCarrick asked me to accept the position of a National Catholic Chaplain to advise both the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops and the Boy Scouts of America (2004-2013).

At OLVP I enjoy meeting with and preparing couples for the baptism of their children, teaching confirmands and their parents as they approach Confirmation, interviewing all children preparing for First Eucharist, and hosting bible study for high school students.

I plan to celebrate 40 years with you by holding an evening reception on Friday 11 May 2012, and by presiding at an evening mass on Saturday 12 May 2012. – Fr. Ray

Eucharist/Penance/Reconciliation

Forty-three parish children joined us on Saturday, 5 November for their first Penance and Reconciliation "Getting Ready Day". One of God's greatest gifts to us is the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Like a precious heirloom that has been handed down from generation to generation, this sacrament is a gift you've been given that you can now celebrate with your child(ren). The children will receive the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation on Saturday, 28 January 2012 in a Communal Penance Celebration with their families followed by a reception in Founders Hall.

In the Eucharist, we enter into the mystery that Jesus loves us so much that he offers his actual presence to us in this Blessed Sacrament. We will continue our preparation with the parents and children on Saturday, 25 February at our second "Getting Ready Day".

On the Fourth Sunday of Lent, 18 March 2012 at the 9:00 a.m. mass, Fr. Ray will continue the tradition of giving the children a special pin to wear until their First Eucharist. – Michele Olewack

HAITI

As a member of OLVP's Social Concerns Committee, I had the opportunity to meet with Msgr. Suffrard, the new Pastor of Our Lady of the Visitation Parish in Gonaives, Haiti, during a recent visit he made to our area. The message below provides greetings, an update on our sister parish, and an outline of some of their more pressing needs. OLVP parishioners have an opportunity to give support to our sister parish this Christmas through our St. Nicholas catalog, which is included with this newsletter and will be available in the Sunday bulletins during Advent. - Jane Stenson



Beloved sisters and brothers of our sister parish. Good morning, peace be with you. I would especially like to greet all the children of our sister parish. The children of the parish of Notre Dame de la Visitation embrace you and greet you cordially. I have come to render grace unto God with you for the wonders He has accomplished in favor of the American people, for His many blessings and especially for the spiritual and brotherly love between our two parishes.

By living the mystery of charity, this relationship has become an evangelical testimony: "that the strong uphold the weak and that the weak, in their turn, pray for the strong". Despite the suffering inherent to all human life as well as the threat to America brought by the enemies of peace, your families do live in peace and serenity because God is your guide and your protector. Together, let us praise the Lord because His love of those that fear Him, endures from age to age.

Thanks to all the faithful of your parish for your generosity and your sincere wish to support the good works of the parish, Notre Dame de la Visitation, Gonaives. Thank you for proving your compassion and economic support, needed due to our lack of resources, are founded on respect for our dignity.

I have the privilege and immense pleasure to tell you about my parish. We seem to hear nothing but bad news concerning Haiti. However, in many respects, the school of Notre Dame de la Visitation continues to function thanks to the school canteen program. Thanks to this program, we have obtained an excellent result with 100% of students successfully passing the 6th grade official exam.

Students are more awake in class. Thanks to the school canteen, cases of children suffering from diseases due to malnutrition have considerably decreased.

In the name of the poorest children of our sister parish in Haiti, I would ask you as much as you possibly can, to enlarge the scope of this program to include the children of Father Marcel Sainte Marie, which has also come under the responsibility of the parish, so they can benefit equally from this program.

Beloved brothers and sisters, my most immediate concern is the repair of the parish infrastructure. The parish church is in very bad condition. The roof has been repaired with the help of the Koch Foundation.

The rectory of the parish remains unfinished. Still remaining to be done is the plastering of the walls, completion of the masonry, laying of the tiles, painting, completion of the electrical wiring, glazing of the windows, the doors and the electrical appliances. All of this work requires a lot of money. Whatever monetary contribution you could make would help us to advance the project.

I also hope to construct a new building to house the school of Notre Dame de la Visitation, as the old building is badly dilapidated, having been periodically assaulted by floods. Also, the roof is full of rust and holes. I ask you to help your sister parish with your customary and unconditional support.

Beloved sisters and brothers, I give blessings to heaven for you as the United States remains a welcoming land. Without doubt, it is a special grace and benediction from God. I invite you, brothers and sisters, to grow your unconditional love of God, who loves the poor and to spread your faith by persevering in the love of your fellow man.

I am grateful for your benevolent attention. Thank you.

OLVP PRAYER CHAIN



Recently, questions have been received from parishioners asking, "What is the OLVP prayer chain mentioned in the bulletin each week?". The OLVP prayer chain is group of parishioners who pray every day for the special intentions of parishioners, their families, friends, colleagues and others. When prayer requests are received at the parish office, an email is sent to the members of the prayer group requesting their prayers for the new intention. For a minimum of two weeks, the special intention is remembered by each member of the prayer group in their personal prayers.

Any member of Our Lady of the Visitation Parish can join the prayer group by calling the parish office during regular business hours (see contact information below). You will be placed on the email list to receive all future prayer requests. Members pray for these special intentions through individual prayer, such as the rosary, personal prayer, prayers at mass, or whatever form of prayer they choose. Members of the prayer chain do not meet as a group, so individuals can pray whenever it is convenient for them. Parishioners are encouraged to join this group to add to the number of individuals praying for the very important needs of fellow parishioners.

Anyone can call the parish office with a prayer request for any special intention. The prayer request will immediately be sent out to all the members of the prayer chain. Parishioners should know that for privacy, only the first name of the person is used when sending out prayer requests. If a parishioner prefers, no name will be given, just the nature of the prayer request.
